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PATIENT PRE-SURGICAL INSTRUCTIONS

The instructions listed below are meant to serve as a general guideline. They should not be used instead of instructions that have been given to you by your doctor.

- 1. **DO NOT** eat or drink after midnight the night before surgery. Prescribed medication should be taken with a sip of water.
- 2. **DO NOT** take any aspirin, aspirin compounds, or anti-inflammatory medications beginning one week (seven days) prior to surgery such as aspirin, ibuprofen, Motrin, Advil, Naprosyn, Aleve, vitamin-e, St. John's Wort, ginkgo, and ginseng. You may take Tylenol.
- 3. **DO NOT** drink any alcoholic beverages beginning one week (seven days) prior to surgery. NO EXCEPTIONS!
- 4. **DO NOT** bring valuables with you on the day of surgery.
- 5. **DO NOT** wear contact lenses, facial lotion, make-up, hair pins, nail polish, or jewelry on the day of surgery. Try to wear a front-button shirt; no pullovers.
- 6. If you develop a cough, cold, or fever, please call your surgeon as soon as possible prior to surgery. Your surgeon may need to see you and evaluate your condition.
- 7. If you live alone, please make arrangements for someone to stay with you on the first night after surgery or to have someone available to call if you need help.
- 8. Please make arrangements to have someone take you home after your surgery. You cannot drive after receiving anesthesia. The hospital requires an adult escort to take you home after surgery.
